FBI FILE FACT SHEET

- The primary function of the FBI is law enforcement.
 The FBI does not keep a file on every citizen of the United States
- The FBI was not established until 1908 and we have very few records prior to the 1920's.
- **FBI files generally contain reports** of FBI investigations of a wide range of matters, including counterterrorism, counter-intelligence, cyber crime, public corruption, civil rights, organized crime, white-collar crime, major thefts/violent crime, and applicants.
- The FBI does not issue clearances or nonclearances for anyone other than its own personnel or persons having access to FBI facilities. Background investigations for security clearances are conducted by many different Government agencies. Persons who received a clearance while in the military or employed with some other government agency should contact that entity. Most government agencies have websites which are accessible on the internet which have their contact information.
- An identification record or "rap sheet" is NOT the same as an FBI "file" it is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and related documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization or military service. The subject of a "rap sheet" may obtain a copy by submitting a written request to FBI, Criminal Justice Information submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. The subject of a "rap sheet" may obtain a copy by submitting a written request to FBI, Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division, Record Request, 1000 Custer Hollow Road, Clarksburg, West Virginia 26306. Along with a specific written request, the individual must submit a new full set of his/her fingerprints in order to locate the record, establish positive identification, and ensure that an individual's records is not disseminated to an unauthorized person. The fingerprint submission must include the subject's name, date of birth and place of birth. There is a required fee of \$18 for this service which must be submitted in the form of a money order or certified bank check made payable to the Treasury of the United States. A credit card payment option is also available. Forms for this option and additional directions may be obtained by accessing the FBI Web site at www.fbi.gov/hq/cjisd/fprequest.htm. States.
- The National Name Check Program (NNCP) conducts a search of the FBI's Universal Index (UNI) to identify any information contained in FBI records that may be associated with an individual and provides the results of that search to the requesting Federal, State or local agency. For the NNCP, a name is searched in a multitude of combinations and phonetic spellings to ensure all records are located. The NNCP also searches for both "main" and "cross reference" files. A main file is an entry that carries the name corresponding to the subject of a file while a cross reference is merely a mention of an individual contained in a file. The results from a search of this magnitude can result in several "hits" and "idents" on an individual. In each instance where UNI has identified a name variation or reference, information must be reviewed to determine whether it is applicable to the individual in question.
- The Record/Information Dissemination Section/Freedom of Information-Privacy Act (FOIPA) search for records provides copies of FBI files relevant to a FOIPA request for information. FOIPA provides responsive documents to requestors seeking "reasonably described information." For a FOIPA search, the subject name, event, activity, business, or event is searched to determine whether there is an investigative file associated with the subject. This is called a "main file search" and differs from the NNCP search.



This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated October 27, 2011. The collection, maintenance and disclosure of the records to which you seek access, like the records of all Federal agencies, are governed by the provisions of the Privacy Act (5 U.S.C. 552a). The Federal law prohibits disclosure of such records in the absence of written authorization of the individuals to whom the records pertain.

Also, the Privacy Act allows for the release of documents pertaining to an individual if disclosure is required by the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). In this regard, we have determined that disclosure of the records you have requested could constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, and as such, would be exempt from disclosure pursuant to exemptions (b)(6) and/or (b)(7)(C) of the FOIA.

As the FBI has publically stated, a review of our records revealed that in the aftermath of the 9/11 attacks, the FBI received a large number of calls from the public reporting suspicious activity. At no time during the course of its investigation of the attacks, known as the PENTTBOM investigation, did the FBI develop credible evidence that connected the address at 4224 Escondido Circle, Sarasota, Florida to any of the 9/11 hijackers.

You have the right to appeal any denials in this release. Appeals should be directed in writing to the Director, Office of Information Policy (OIP), U.S. Department of Justice, 1425 New York Ave., NW, Suite 11050, Washington, D.C. 20530-0001. This is an appeal of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Feb. 7, 2012 denial of my expedited FOIA request dated Oct. 27, 2011.

My request pertains to the FBI investigation into the 9/11 terrorist attacks, specifically that part of the inquiry that focused on a residence at 4224 Escondito Circle, near Sarasota, FI. FBI Records Section Chief David M. Hardy denied my request after erroneously determining that disclosure would constitute "an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." In fact, I sought no information about any specific individual – and none are named in my request.

Any legitimate privacy concerns for individuals that may arise from my request could easily be remedied by excising their names before the records are released. That easy solution should have been offered to me by Mr. Hardy, but was not.

Mr. Hardy's denial was also deficient in that he did not provide me with the number of pages that were being withheld, or make a reasonable estimate regarding the volume of the information that was withheld. I appeal that defacto denial, too, and ask that those numbers be provided to me.

You appealed from the action of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on your request for access to records concerning an investigation relating to 4224 Escondito Circle, Sarasota, Florida.

The Freedom of Information Act provides for disclosure of many agency records. At the same time, Congress included in the FOIA nine exemptions from disclosure that provide protection for important interests such as personal privacy, privileged communications, and certain law enforcement activities. After carefully considering your appeal, I am affirming, on partly modified grounds, the FBI's action on your request. To the extent that responsive records exist, without consent, proof of death, official acknowledgment of an investigation, or an overriding public interest, disclosure of law enforcement records concerning an individual could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(C). I note that the FBI informed you that it conducted a search for responsive records but found no "credible evidence that connected the address at 4224 Escondido Circle. Sarasota, Florida to any of the 9/11 hijackers." I further note that while the FBI conducted a search in this instance, the FBI properly asserted Exemption 7(C) and was not required to conduct a search for the requested records. See Blackwell v. FBI, 646 F.3d 37, 41-42 (D.C. Cir. 2011) (upholding agency's refusal to conduct a search for law enforcement records pertaining to named third parties because such records are categorically exempt from disclosure in the absence of an overriding public interest).

Furthermore, I am denying your request that we itemize and justify each item of the information withheld. You are not entitled to such a listing at the administrative stage of processing FOIA requests and appeals. See Bangoura v. U.S. Dep't of the Army, 607 F. Supp. 2d 134, 143 n.8 (D.D.C. 2009).

Please be advised that this Office's decision was made only after a full review of this matter. Your appeal was assigned to an attorney with this Office who thoroughly reviewed and analyzed your appeal, your underlying request, and the actions of the FBI in response to your request.

Dear Mr. Chairman:

This responds to your letter to Attorney General Holder and FBI Director Mueller dated September 14, 2011, seeking information about alleged links between a Saudi family living in Florida and the 9/11 hijackers. Specifically, your letter asks whether this matter was investigated by the FBI and whether information developed by the FBI was disclosed to Congress and to the 9/11 Commission's inquiry. This letter supplements information provided orally by the FBI to your staff last month.

In the aftermath of the 9/11 attacks, the FBI received a large number of calls from the public reporting suspicious activity. Among those, the FBI received at least three calls regarding the alleged abrupt departure of residents of a specific address in Sarasota. Florida shortly before the 9/11 attacks. During the course of its investigation of the attacks, known as the PENTTBOM investigation, the FBI followed up on these calls but found no credible evidence of any contact between the hijackers and the family; nor did the investigation find any evidence whatsoever of any physical visits or telephone, email or financial contact between the hijackers and family. Members of the Saudi family were subsequently located and interviewed. Contrary to suggestions in media reports, the FBI did not develop any evidence that connected the family members to any of the 9/11 hijackers or to the 9/11 plot.

During the course of the Joint Congressional Inquiry into the events of 9/11. congressional investigators were granted access to virtually all PENTTBOM-related documents, with the exception of material protected by Rule 6(e) of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure. The records concerning the Sarasota matter are not protected by Rule 6(e) and were therefore available to congressional investigators. During the eight-month period of the inquiry, the Joint Inquiry staff reviewed tens of thousands of documents in the FBI's possession and the FBI formally produced records to staff investigators upon request. In total, the FBI produced more than 24,000 pages of records through this process. The records of the Joint Congressional Inquiry were subsequently transferred to the 9/11 Commission. As a result of their review of FBI records, congressional investigators focused on several aspects of the PENTTBOM investigation originating in Florida, but the FBI is unable to ascertain whether these investigators

reviewed records concerning the Sarasota family. The FBI also has not identified any specific requests made by the investigators concerning the Sarasota family.

We very much appreciate the concern that prompted your inquiry. We can assure you that the FBI's response to the 9/11 attacks was comprehensive and unprecedented. Special agents responded to more than 500,000 investigative leads, collected and processed more than 150,000 pieces of evidence and conducted more than 167,000 interviews in order to find out everything possible about the attack. In addition, the investigations conducted by the Joint Congressional Inquiry and the 9/11 Commission were exhaustive efforts to understand the events leading up to the attacks. The FBI cooperated fully with those efforts and provided voluminous information to congressional and Commission staff.

We hope this information is helpful. Please do not hesitate to contact this office if we may be of further assistance in this or any other matter.
