Joint Pretrial Stipulation

The parties jointly file the following pretrial stipulation pursuant to S.D. Fla. Local Gen. Rule 16.1(e).

1. Statement of the Case by Each Party.

a. <u>Plaintiffs</u>. This is a Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") enforcement action, by two plaintiffs, Broward Bulldog, Inc. and Dan Christensen, against the U.S. Department of Justice and the FBI seeking records of an investigation initiated in September 2001 against Saudi nationals who lived in Sarasota, but fled their home shortly before terrorists attacked the United States on September 11, 2001. In response to plaintiffs' request, the defendants produced no documents and asserted that whatever responsive documents might existed were exempt from FOIA disclosure requirements by 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(6) and (b)(7)(C)

which protect personal privacy interests of persons named in the records. After the lawsuit was filed, the defendants announced, without explanation, that they had found 35 pages of records and asserted for the first time that four pages were being withheld entirely, and that portions of the records were being withheld pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(1) and (b)(3) which exempts records classified as Secret by an Executive Order and documents required to be kept confidential by the National Security Act of 1947.

Plaintiffs contend that the defendants have not shown that they have made a good faith search for documents responsive to their request and have not shown that the records that they have found and withheld or that portions of the documents that they have redacted are exempt from FOIA disclosure requirements. Their arguments are supported in this regard by the detailed declaration of former U.S. Senator D. Robert Graham who chaired the Joint Inquiry of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence and House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence ("the Joint Inquiry"). Sen. Graham asserts in his declaration that the FBI interfered with the mission of the Joint Inquiry by concealing its Sarasota investigation, that the FBI has not produced to the plaintiffs responsive FBI investigative records that he has seen, and that the FBI should have hundreds or thousands of pages of additional documents. The documents that the FBI belatedly produced to the plaintiffs after the filing of this lawsuit reflects that the Sarasota investigation in fact found many connections between the Sarasota Saudis and persons associated with the terrorists who attacked the United States on September 11, 2001, but that the FBI has made public statements claiming that no such connections were found. The public and the press have a profound interest in understanding the apparent inconsistencies in the records and the FBI's public statements, why the FBI concealed its investigation from the official congressional

investigations, and why no law enforcement agencies have taken any further action to determine whether the Sarasota Saudis in fact provided aid and comfort to the 9/11 terrorists.

The defendants have not carried their burden to demonstrate that they have made a good faith search for the requested records and they also have not shown that any of the asserted FOIA exemptions allow them to continue to withhold the requested records of this historic and important investigation.

- b. <u>Defendants</u>. Defendants contend that they have conducted a reasonable search for records responsive to plaintiffs' FOIA request and properly applied FOIA exemptions to withhold information and four pages of records exempt from FOIA's disclosure requirements pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §§ 552(b)(1), (b)(3), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(D), and (b)(7)(E). Defendants also contend that any reasonably segregable non-exempt information has been provided to plaintiffs and that there are no records or information being improperly withheld from plaintiffs.
- 2. <u>Basis of Federal Jurisdiction</u>. This Court has subject matter jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §§ 552(a)(4)(B), and original jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331.
 - 3. <u>Pleadings Raising the Issues.</u>
 - a. The Complaint (DE-1).
- b. Because the defendants have filed a motion to dismiss (DE-5) and no ruling has been made as yet on the motion, the defendants have not yet filed an answer.
 - 4. Undisposed of Motions or Other Matters Requiring the Court's Attention.
 - a. Defendants' Motion to Dismiss the Complaint (DE-5).
 - b. Defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment (DE-25).

- c. Plaintiffs' Motion to Strike Hardy Declaration or to Allow Deposition of Hardy (DE-26).
 - d. Plaintiffs' Motion for *Vaughn* Index and *In Camera* Review. (DE-27).
 - e. Defendants' Motion for Protective Order (DE-33).
 - f. Plaintiffs intend to move to compel responses to Plaintiffs' First Set of Interrogatories and First Request for Production of Documents shortly.
- 5. <u>Concise Statement of Uncontested Facts Requiring No Proof at Trial and Reservations.</u>
- a. By letter dated September 26, 2011, plaintiffs submitted a FOIA request to FBI Headquarters for "information pertaining to a closed anti-terrorism investigation into the activities of Saudi nationals who lived in and/or owned a residence at 4224 Escondito Circle, near Sarasota, Florida prior to 9/11."
- b. The request identified the residents at 4225 Escondito Circle and the owners of the residence by name and requested that a search be conducted of the FBI's indices to the Central Records System and the filings system of the FBI's Tampa field office.
- c. By letter dated October 6, 2011, the FBI informed plaintiffs that, since their September 26, 2011, request (FOIPA Request No. 1174909-000) concerned a third party (or parties), the request could not be processed unless they provided a third party privacy waiver or proof of death or a clear demonstration that the public interest in disclosure outweighs the personal privacy interest and that significant public benefit would result from the disclosure of the requested records.
- d. The FBI further advised plaintiffs that, upon request, the FBI would search for public records contained within the FBI's files.

- e. The FBI also informed plaintiffs that they could appeal the FBI's response by writing to DOJ's Office of Information Policy ("OIP") within sixty days.
- f. By email dated October 27, 2011, plaintiffs submitted a FOIA request to FBI Headquarters for "information pertaining to an anti-terrorism investigation regarding activities at the residence at 4224 Escondito Circle, in the Prestancia development near Sarasota, Florida prior to 9/11/2001."
- g. Plaintiffs noted that "[t]his request is a modified version of FOIPA request 1174909-000" and "concerns no third parties."
- h. The FBI acknowledged receipt of plaintiffs' October 27, 2011, modified request and assigned it FOIPA Request No. 1176403-000.
- i. By letter dated February 7, 2012, the FBI advised plaintiffs that the records they sought are governed by the provisions of the Privacy Act and that disclosure of those records could constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy pursuant to FOIA Exemptions (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C).
- j. The FBI informed plaintiffs, however, that, while the FBI had received a large number of calls concerning suspicious activity in the aftermath of the 9/11 attack, no credible evidence was developed to connect the address at 4224 Escondito Circle, Sarasota, Florida to any of the 9/11 hijackers.
- k. Finally, the FBI advised plaintiffs of their right to appeal the FBI's response to OIP within sixty days.
- By letter dated February 23, 2012, plaintiffs appealed the FBI's February 7, 2012 response to OIP. OIP acknowledged receipt of plaintiffs' appeal letter and assigned it no. AP-2012-01599.

- m. On May 23, 2012, OIP responded to plaintiffs' February 23, 2012, appeal letter by affirming the FBI's action on partly modified grounds. OIP noted that the FBI had conducted a search for responsive records although it was not required to do so under the circumstances.
 - n. Plaintiffs filed the above-captioned action on September 5, 2012.
- o. The Central Records System ("CRS") is the system used by the FBI to maintain the records and information which it compiles for law enforcement purposes, including records maintained at FBI Headquarters and in FBI field offices.
 - p. The CRS files are searched by means of General Indices.
- q. By letter dated March 28, 2013, the FBI advised plaintiffs that it had reviewed 35 pages responsive to their October 27, 2011, request and was releasing 31 pages, with information deleted pursuant to FOIA Exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(D), and (b)(7)(E).
 - 6. <u>Issues of Fact that Remain to Be Litigated.</u>
 - a. The following are factual issues which remain to be decided:
- 1. Whether the defendants conducted a reasonable good faith search for documents responsive to the plaintiffs' FOIA request.
- 2. Whether the defendants properly withheld and redacted documents responsive to the plaintiffs' FOIA request pursuant to the asserted exemptions.
- b. However, it is defendant's position that these issues should not be tried because defendants have submitted evidence sufficient to establish that a reasonable search was conducted and that FOIA exemptions were properly applied, and plaintiffs have failed to present evidence sufficient to raise an issue of fact as to the reasonableness or good faith of the search.

7. <u>Issues of Law on Which There is Agreement.</u>

- a. In a FOIA action ""the agency must show beyond material doubt . . . that it has conducted a search reasonably calculated to uncover all relevant documents," "Ray v. U.S. Dep't of Justice, 908 F.2d 1549, 1558 (11th Cir. 1990) (citations omitted), rev'd on other grounds, 502 U.S. 164 (1991).
- b. The agency "may meet this burden by producing affidavits of responsible officials 'so long as the affidavits are relatively detailed, nonconclusory, and submitted in good faith." *Id.* (citation omitted); *see also Miccosukee Tribe of Indians of Fla. v. United States*, 516 F.3d 1235, 1248 (11th Cir. 2008).
- c. "If the government agency meets its burden of proving that its search was reasonable, then the burden shifts to the requester to rebut the agency's evidence by showing that the search was not reasonable or was not conducted in good faith." *Ray*, 908 F.2d at 1558.
- d. Exemption 1, 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(1), protects from disclosure matters that are (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive Order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy; and (B) are in fact properly classified pursuant to such Executive Order. Executive Order 13526, signed December 29, 2009, now governs classification of national security information.
- e. The classification "'Secret' shall be applied to information, the unauthorized disclosure of which reasonably could be expected to cause serious damage to the national security that the original classification authority is able to identify or describe." E.O. 13526 §1.2(a)(2).
- f. Exemption 3, 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(3), exempts from disclosure under FOIA provisions matters specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than 5 U.S.C. §

552(b)) if that statute requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on the issue; or establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld; and, if enacted after the date of enactment of the OPEN FOIA Act of 2009, specifically cites to 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(3).

- g. The section of the National Security Act of 1947 relied upon to withhold portions of the requested documents, 50 U.S.C. §403-1(i)(1), provides "The Director of National Intelligence shall protect sources and methods from unauthorized disclosure."
- h. Exemption 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6), exempts from disclosure "personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy."
- i. Exemption 7(C), 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(7)(C), exempts from disclosure "records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information...could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy."
- j. Exemption 7(D), 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(7)(C), exempts from disclosure "records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information...(D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of a record or information compiled by criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source."

k. Exemption 7(E), 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(7)(E), exempts from disclosure "records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information...(E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law."

8. Issues of Law Which Remain for Determination by the Court.

- a. Plaintiffs contend that the following are issues of law to be determined by the Court:
- 1. Whether the defendants' motion for summary judgment should be granted or denied.
- 2. Whether the Declaration of David M. Hardy should be stricken or not and if so, whether or not the plaintiffs should be allowed the opportunity to take the deposition of Mr. Hardy.
- 3. Whether or not defendants should be compelled to answer the First Set of Interrogatories and produce the records sought by the First Request for Production.
- 4. Whether defendants should be compelled or not to conduct a further search for documents responsive to plaintiffs' request.
- 5. Whether or not the defendants should be compelled to provide the Court and the defendants a *Vaughn* index of responsive documents.
- 6. Whether or not the defendants should be compelled to submit for *in camera* review all responsive documents.
 - b. Defendants contend that the following are issues of law in this case:

- 1. As a preliminary matter, the Court must determine whether or not it has an adequate factual basis for determination of the issues in this case, and, if not, the method by which an adequate factual basis should be provided in this case.
- 2. Whether or not discovery should be allowed in this case, and, if so, what limitations should be placed upon any discovery allowed.
